

Roy learned to sail in an El Toro that he finished from a bare hull in the '60s. He sailed in Kawaihae and Hilo Bay. 



Sail Training Vessel "Irving Johnson" in Hilo by Mike Pearson

On Sunday, February 29th the 90 one swabfoot (110' counting spars) sail training vessel "Irving Johnson" arrived in Hilo Bay after crossing from La Paz, Mexico by way of Socorro and Clarion Islands. The ship arrived with students from Long Island University who are taking semester at sea courses.


The "Irving Johnson" and her twin "Exy Johnson" are traditional rigged brigantines constructed and fitted out in San Pedro, California. They are owned and operated by the Los Angeles Maritime Museum. Commissioned just about 1 year ago the "Irving Johnson's" passage to Hawaii is her longest to date while the "Exv Johnson" sails in her home waters of southern California.

Mike Pearson spoke with the captain on VHF prior to their entering Bolln. The Hilo Bay and went out to greet them in his tender. About 2 days out of Hilo they encountered the storm that hit the islands. Needless to say their return "Aloha" from the rigging was full of enthusiasm for their arrival. Once dockside the captain had every-

bing and cleaning and with only 2 days in port offered to give a tour of the ship. Lisa Parr brought 17 of her marine science students and Mike rounded up the cruisers from Radio Bay along with Barry and Pat 2nd mate spoke

about the

building of the ship, her namesake and their plans to cruise the Hawaiian Islands before heading back to California about April 1st. For more information on the Los


Some Sailing Scenes



One key to a good start is not to stray too far from the committee boat. Here Sunfish and Walker Bay 10s jockey for a good start position and starboard tack Sunfish the other side of the Commit-

tee Boat is in the best position if not over the line early. Port tack Sunfish behind will have to stav out of the way of all boats unless he tacks to starboard. The photo at right shows. One starboard

tack boat and three port tack boats in various stages of sail trim. Closest Sunfish is undertrimmed. Walker Bay is overtrimmed and Sunfish to the rear is trimmed just about right.
