

## Hobie 16 "Getaway" skippers - Philip Tait

#### Sailing day procedure

Philip will verify that the prospective skipper is on the list. The skipper must hand over the boat back to Philip at the end of the trip, so that Philip can verify that the next skipper is qualified - the skipper has no authority to pass along control of the boat to another person.

#### Procedure for using the boat at other times

At least one day's notice is required. Philip is willing to tow the boat for pickup in front of the Subaru Telescope base facility, mauka of UHH campus. Prospective skipper will need a hitch with a 2-inch ball, and a standard 4-pin lighting connector.

#### Qualifications

- To be admitted to this list, a prospective skipper must: Demonstrate competence in recovering from a capsize.
- 2. Take responsibility for any damage to the boat caused by the skipper's error.
- Additional qualifications for taking the boat out other than on a Sailing day. Demonstrate competence in:
  - rigging the boat, with particular attention to safety of helpers and bystanders. In particular, the mast is quite unwieldy, and requires 2 tall, fit people to hold it up while a third competent helper secures the forestay.
- 4. loading and unloading the boat from the trailer, have a vehicle suitable for launching that is properly equipped for towing, and demonstrate competence in checking the boat and trailer are in safe condition for towing.



# Bigger Boat Sailing Qualifications and Requirements - John Luchau

Hilo Sailing Org and Reeds Bay Sailing Association are Limited Liability Corporations that own the boats used by Na Hoa Holomoku.

To use these boats on an anytime basis Hilo Sailing Org membership is required. The West Wight Potter, Reinell 26, International Folkboat and Wharram 23 catamaran as well as the

Hobie catamarans require more than just basic sailing qualifications to be certified for their use. We want them to be used safely by qualified skippers.

Each skipper is responsible for damage to the boats or injury to crew while they are on the boats.

By no means does the \$50 annual membership dues

requirement to be a member of Hilo Sailing Org pay for all the maintenance on the boats. Many members donate equipment, repair items and use their time to keep them sailable.

Join Hilo Sailing Org, get qualified and check out the big boats.

#### Another International Folkboat - Ron Reilly

Dear Members of Na Hoa Holomoku Yacht Club,

The great little 26 ft Folkboat "Cheers!" has become a great asset to our club. All who have sailed on her are impressed with her performance. She is a joy to sail.

As some of you may know we recently missed out on an opportunity to purchase a second Folkboat on Oahu. By the time we got photos and tried to decide how to gather up the purchase price this boat was in escrow and sold.

Then, by chance, someone found another Folkboat for sail in Lahaina, Maui. The asking price was affordable and this time your Board of Directors made a decision. Past Commodore Jon Olson flew to Maui and came back with photos and a report of a sound hull along with a recent history of some neglect. The negotiated price

was \$4,000 (a brand new Sunfish costs way more than that). We believe we can repair the needed items to make her seaworthy for the sail back to Hilo Bay this summer. The purchase cash was donated or loaned by board members at short notice, and the sale went through.

Some may ask why two Folkboats? Here are some reasons that your board considered:

Apart from being a forgiving, seaworthy, and classic Swedish design these boats are great fun to sail.

For many of us who are still developing our keelboat sailing skills the Folkboat is a perfect boat to learn on.

Having two identical boats will allow us to economize on maintenance skills and replacement parts. Gear that works well on one boat will work well on the other.

Repair and maintenance skills from one boat will transfer to the other.

For those who want to hone their sailing skills two boats will allow us to have match racing, without the distraction of a handicap system.

In the long run the attractiveness of these boats will help strengthen our club and help us maintain an active and involved membership that sails often. At present "Cheers!" and "Whippy" are sailing almost every week.

Now for the hard part. The Maui boat (presently going under the name of "Private Dancer") will need time and money over and above the purchase price. Just as we asked you for help in the acquisition of "Cheers!" we now need and ask for support again.

# Written Exams for Qualification - John Luchau

Future certification to use the catamarans and larger boats will require passing three exams and a practical knot tying exam.

There are written exams being administered for each of two Study Guides that have been distributed.

Volume One (Nomenclature) has been distributed and 19 members have been tested. Volume Two (Sailing Theory) has been given out and five members have tested. So far the best scores (other

than mine) have been attained by Commodore Ron Reilly.

I'll be administering more exams after the potluck on Wednesday the 13th. Study your guides and books on definitions and sail theory.

# Another International Folkboat - Ron Reilly

Items on the short list include, haul-out fees on Maui (\$15 per day), bottom paint (\$200), new running rigging (\$400), new stanchions (being donated by Jon Olson - \$xxx), life lines (\$200), a new tiller (already made from the "Cheers!" template by Guido Lang \$250), new traveler track for the mainsheet (\$100), rudder gudgeon and pintles (\$300), new portlights. (Lexan being donated by John Luchau - \$150)), and headsails (some are already available from our current

boats - \$600), miscellaneous items - (\$500).

We expect that refitting costs to total around \$2,000 (not counting donated volunteer time). Any amount you can donate (money and/or time) will be greatly appreciated. Please make checks out to "Reeds Bay Sailing Organization, LLC" and give them to a board member or mail to PO Box 1661, Keaau, HI As a suggestion \$50 from forty members would be all that is needed. This

amount on top of our yearly dues certainly makes sailing in Hilo one of the best sailing bargains of any club in the country. And all this at fabulous Hilo Bay - one of the most perfect sailing locations in the country (if you were out sailing on Memorial Day you know about perfect conditions!).

On behalf of the Board of Directors, many thanks for your continued support.


